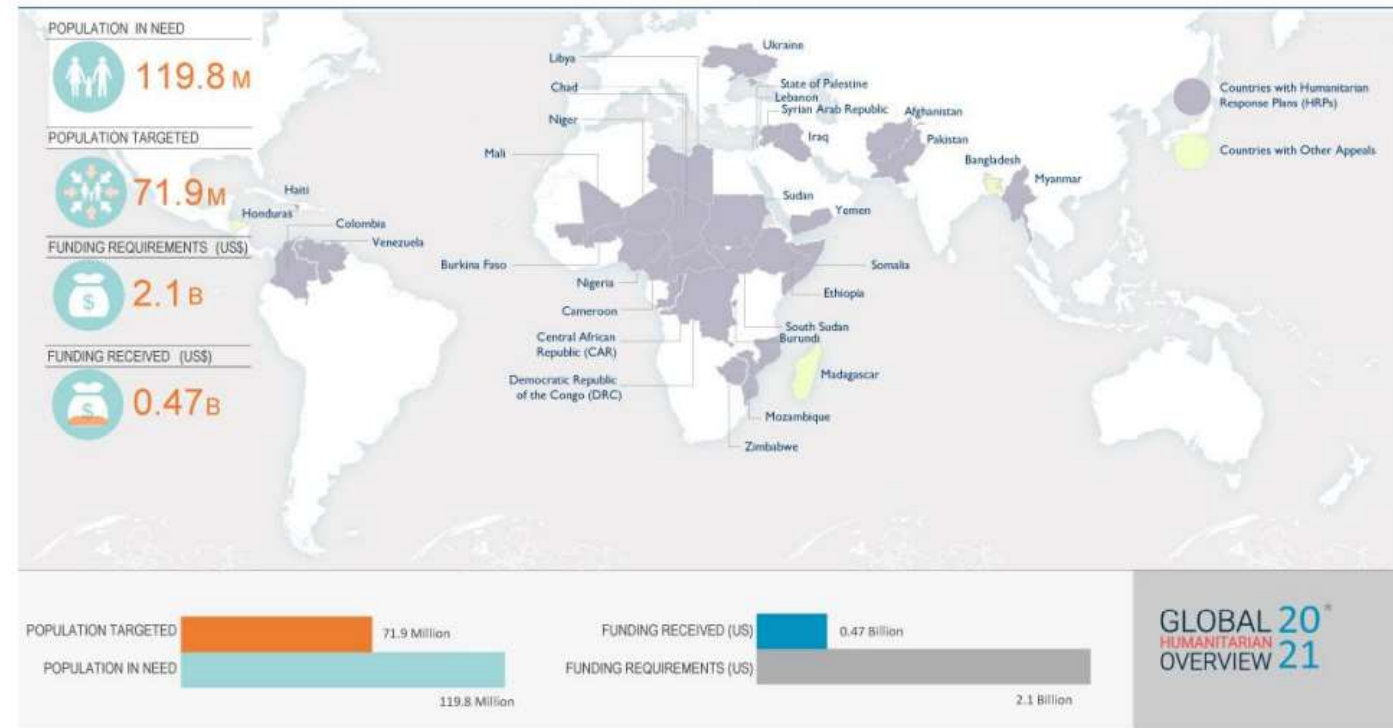
# Global WASH Cluster

# Humanitarian Situation

- Conflict, Covid-19 and climate change
- Devasting toll on health, well-being, economies and livelihoods
- WASH is a key life-saving and preventative measure
- Humanitarian action needs to link to development goals



Covid-19 pushed an additional 20 million people into poverty in crisis-affected countries



# Sustainable Development Goal 6

- Globally, billions lack water and sanitation
- 1 in 3 without handwashing, at risk of Covid-19
- In MENA, 48 million lack water, 71 million lack sanitation
- Accelerate Agenda 2030 to leave no one behind



Achieving global targets by 2030 requires a 4x increase in current progress

# Sustainable Development Goal 6

- Most healthcare facilities lack basic WASH services
- Millions of children at risk, lack of WASH in schools
- Covid-19 impacts widen the gaps
- Some progress, but not enough



WASH services are especially deficient in least-developed countries (LDCs)
