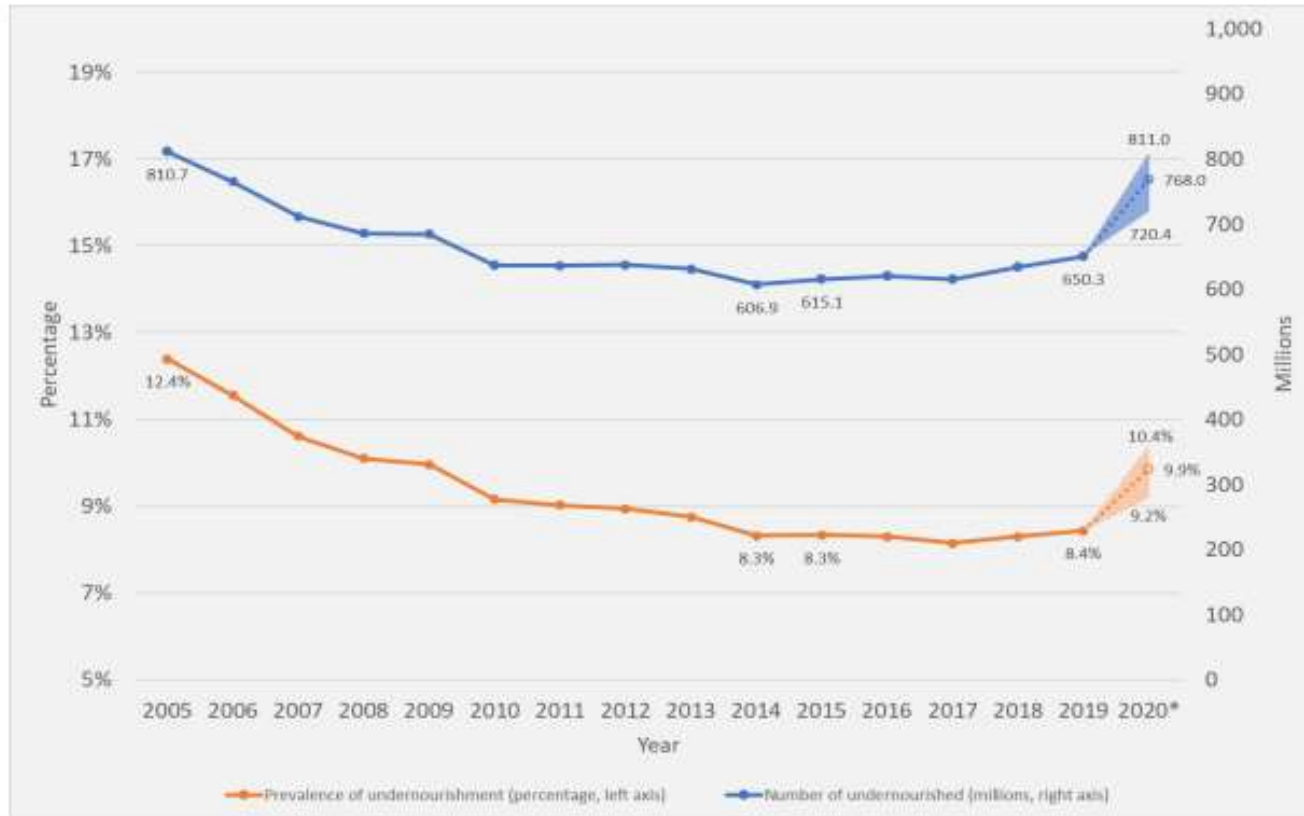

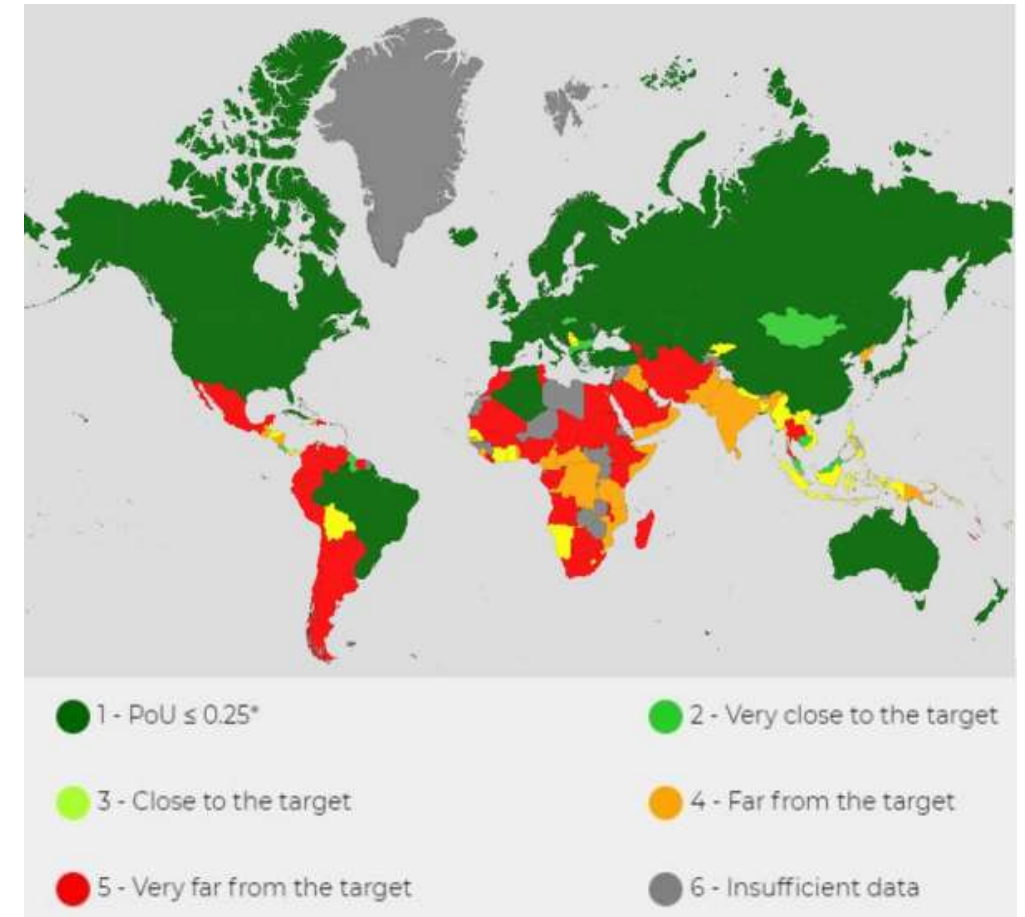

Figure: Number and percentage of undernourished people in the world 2005-2020

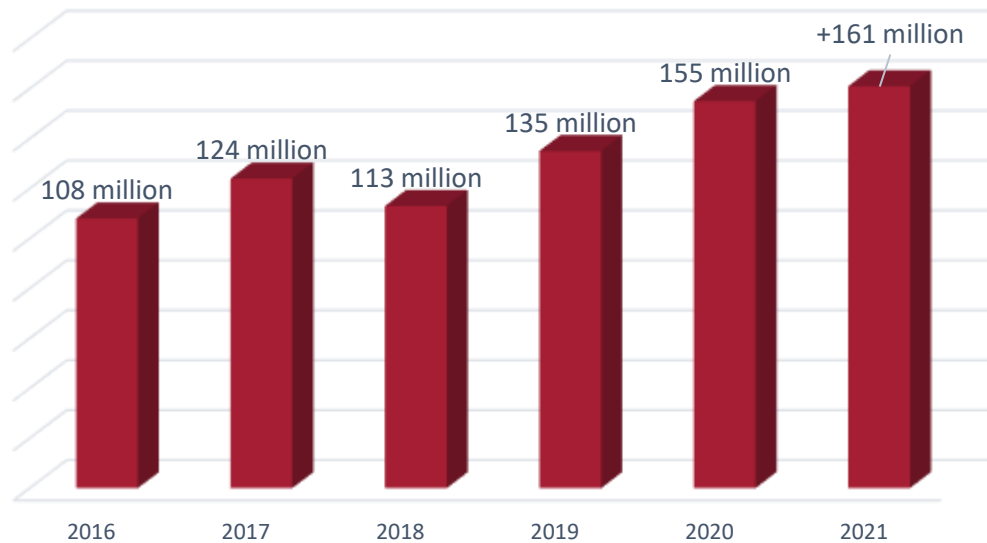


Map: Current distance to the target of SDG indicator 2.1.1 on PoU (2019 data)

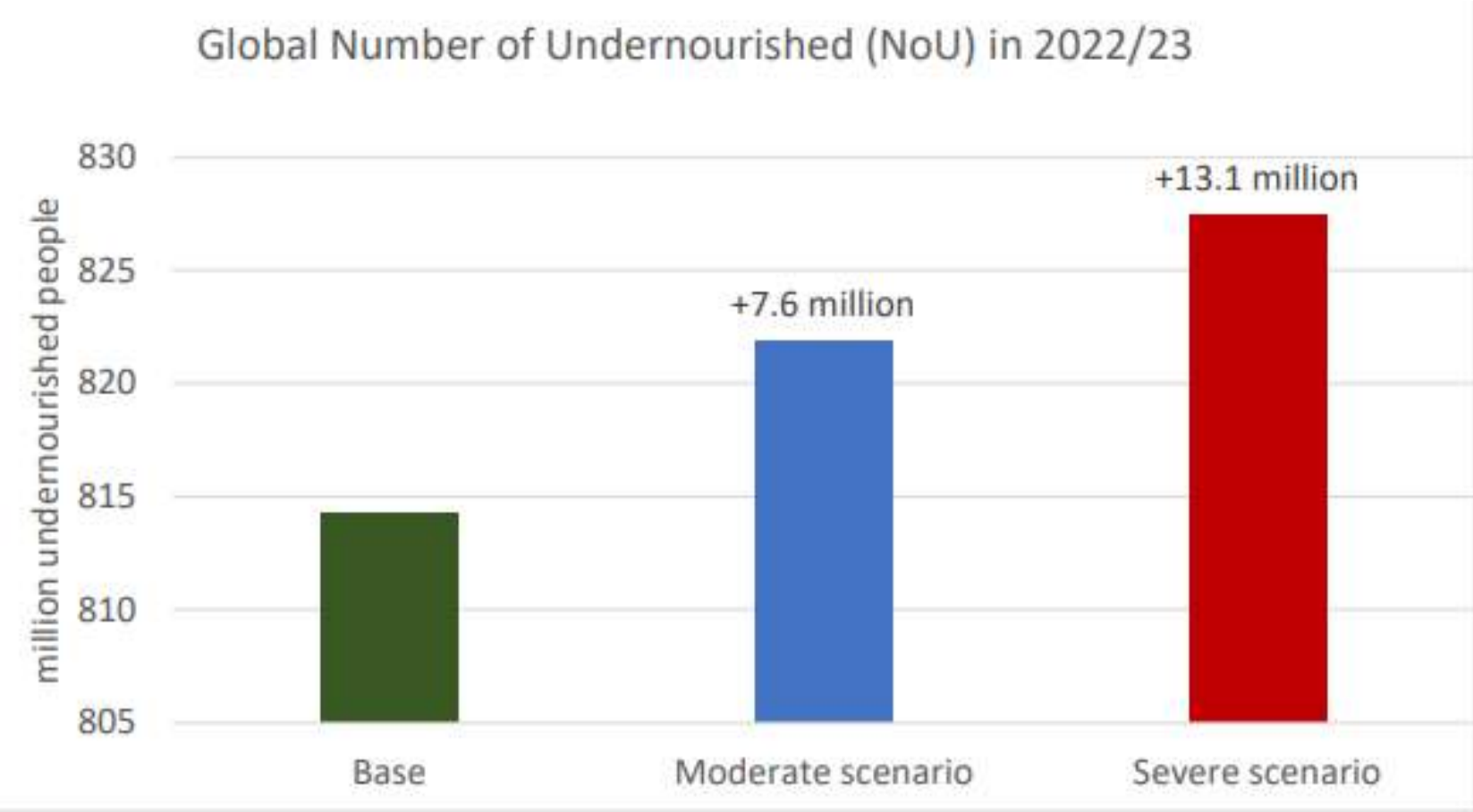

- Operationalizing the humanitarian-development-peace nexus **at scale**
- Multi-sectoral approaches
- Managing risks
- Partnership
 - Global, e.g. Global Network Against Food Crises
 - Regional, e.g. IGAD, CILSS, SICA, etc.
 - National, e.g. national Governments (Post-Food Systems Summit coalitions, national pathways), local organizations, etc.
 - Private sector, e.g. strengthening value chains and securing stable market access
