Yes.

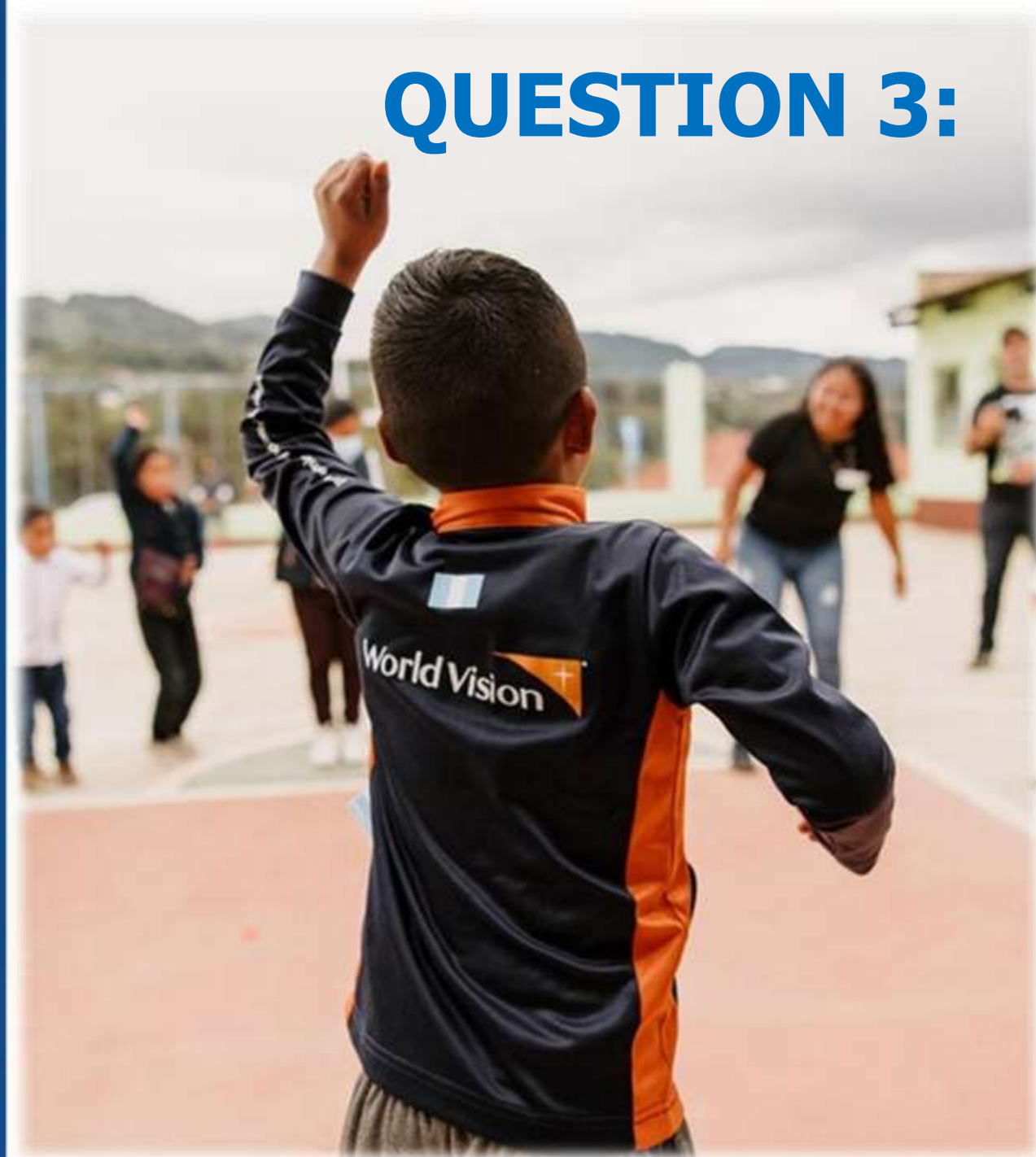

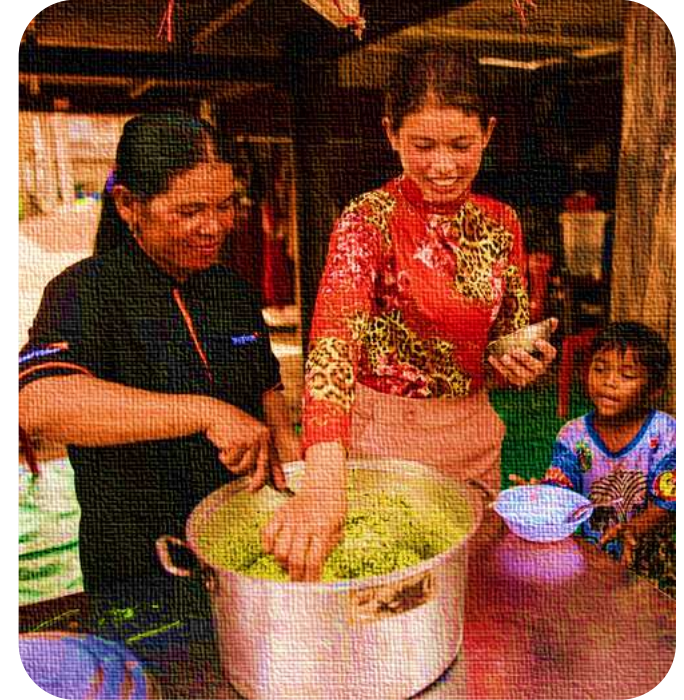
QUESTION 4:
